

What Are The Actual Facts In The "He Said / She Said" Campaign Sound Bites?

Suggestion for use of this table.

1. Ignore media coverage about all of this and just focus on YOUR assessment of which of these items are **factually verified**.
2. Make your own assessment as to which, **if either**, of these candidates is more "guilty" than the other of these things.
3. Ask yourself this question: "Do I actually have a valid reason for picking the "least despicable **person**" to vote for, or for casting a "protest vote" for any other candidate [which is an unwitting vote for one of these two], or for not voting, instead of casting my vote for his/her **party's** platform and ideology?"

* After considerable blowback over calling "half of Trump's supporters a 'basket of deplorables', she did say "I was grossly generalistic, and that's never a good idea. I regret saying 'half' — that was wrong." Most media coverage characterized that as "not an actual apology".
